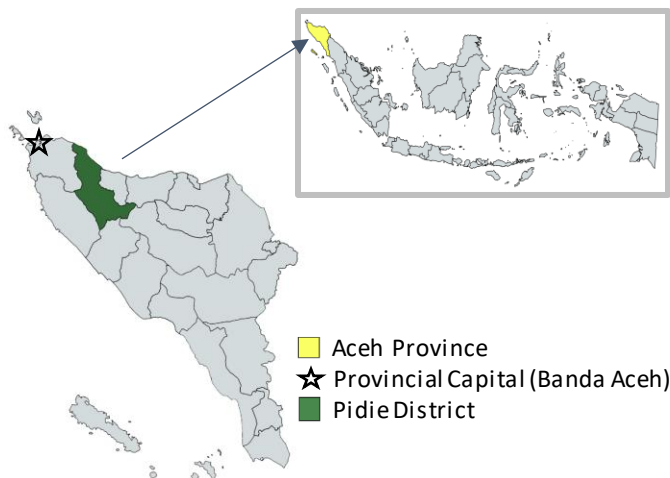

Under the SP4PHC project, ThinkWell Indonesia collaborates with the Ministry of Health (MOH), local governments, and other partners to support the implementation of its primary health care (PHC) transformation reforms. These reforms aim to improve service delivery to the community by making primary health care services more integrated. With support from ThinkWell, MOH is setting up a catalytic learning platform to diagnose, finance, and improve provision of PHC services in Pidie, a district in Aceh Province.

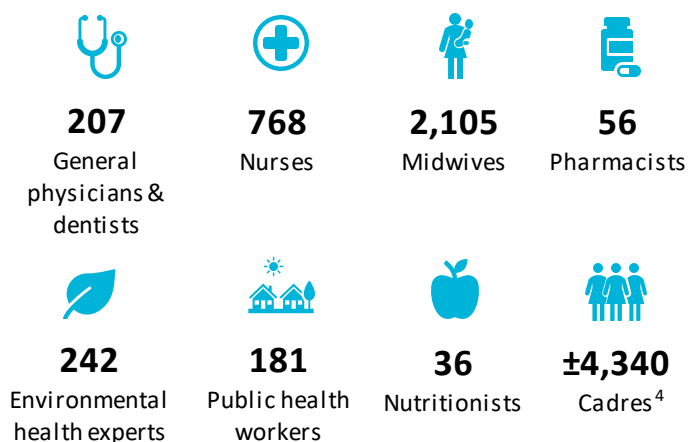

Health Workforce by Type (2021)

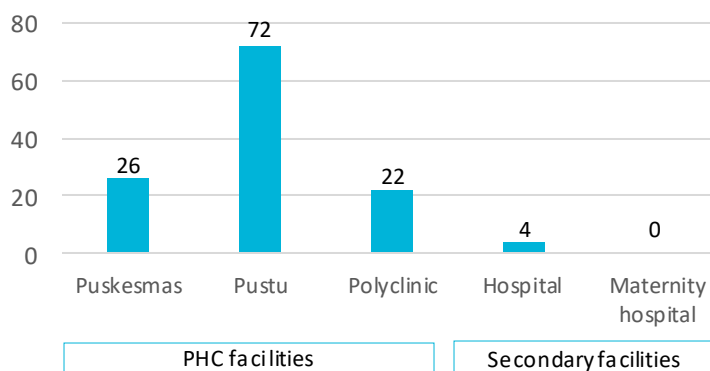

Number of Health Facilities in 2021



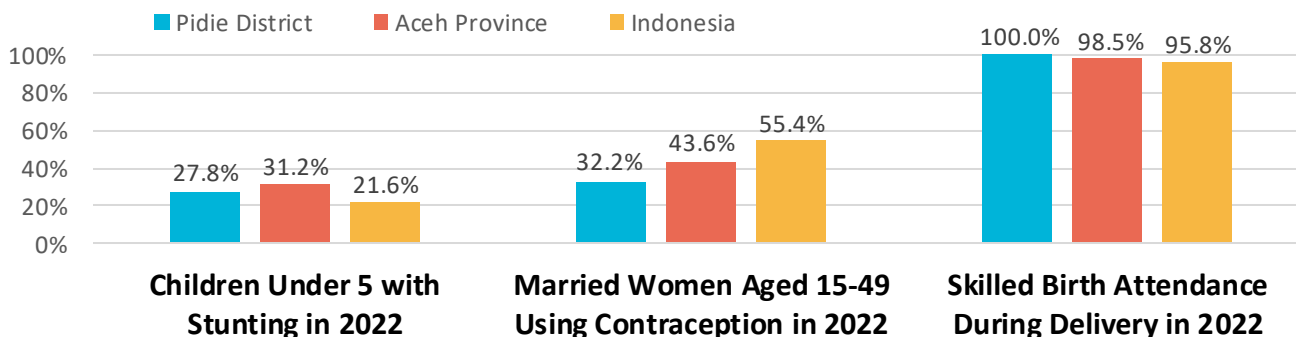

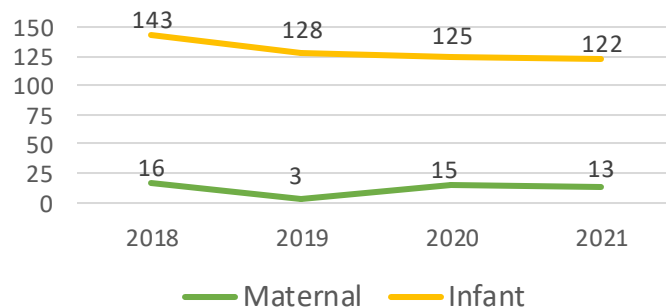
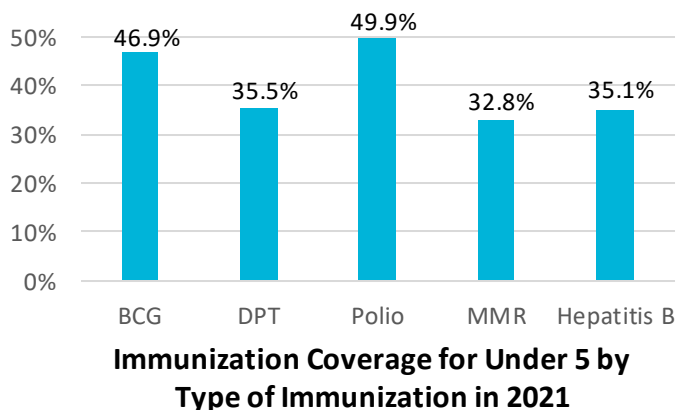

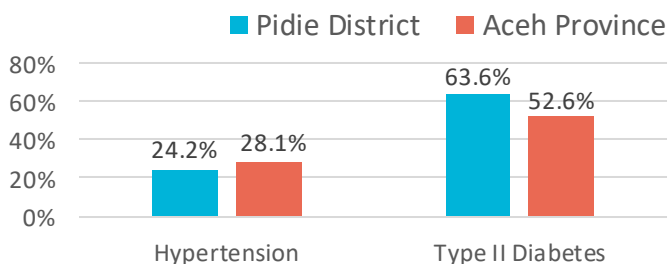

Treatment Coverage for Specified Non-communicable Diseases in 2021

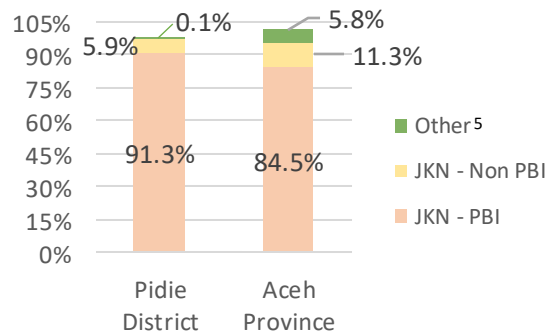

¹ Component of Human Development Index comprised of life expectancy at birth, expected years of schooling, mean years of schooling, and per capita income.
² Healthy Family Index is a composite indicator comprising of 12 health indicators, including access to sanitation and national health insurance, FP and MNCH indicators, and disease treatment coverage. The index is calculated from routine facility Health Management Information System reports; data from April 10, 2023, was reported.
³ Public Health Development Index is a composite indicator comprising of 24 health indicators, including prevalence of communicable and non-communicable diseases, service coverage, and proportion of healthy behaviors. The index is calculated from periodic survey data. No data in 2022, hence data in 2018 was reported instead.
⁴ Due to unavailability of accurate data, the number was estimated by multiplying the number of Posyandu with five cadres for each Posyandu.
⁵ Other insurances comprised of regional health insurance, private insurance, and employment-based insurance.
